Paintings by AN HO (b.1927) and PU RU (1896-1963)





CHINA 2000 FINE ART (177 East 87th Street in Manhattan) takes great pleasure in presenting Paintings by An Ho: Two Sides of the Same Coin, an exhibition of fourteen paintings by the Chinese woman artist, An Ho, four paintings by her teacher, Master Pu Ru (1896-1963) which he gave to her for study purposes and under whom she studied for seventeen years, and one exceptional piece that was painted by the artists jointly. Several of An Ho's paintings have inscriptions by her teacher, and she has inscribed Pu Ru's work.

The paintings by An Ho in the exhibition are divided between those she produced under the direct tutelage of Pu Ru and those painted within the past ten years. An Ho's approach to brushwork (the quality of which is the single most important factor in determining the quality of a Chinese ink painting), laid out for her by Pu Ru, was a model initially advanced in the Song dynasty and to which she was conscientiously devoted. The seven works painted in the mid-1950s are impeccable and brilliant examples of her responsiveness to her teacher's instruction, an enchanting performance and felicitous collaboration. An Ho's minute and patient observation lies behind the visual truthfulness of individual elements. Details are drawn with near-miraculous refinement and a sense of order and clarity prevails in every composition.

Those paintings completed in the past ten years, for the most part landscapes, show a rather different side of the same coin. An Ho's excellence in Chinese brushwork is used as the foundation to reinvent nature with a sense of perfection ideally achieved. Her translucent visions are derived closely from nature, but set forth with such absolute assurance as to create their own, separate reality. An Ho's landscapes are her own poetical fantasy, part memory, part dream, and have the quality of a dream that is more perfect than reality. Her scenes achieve nobility by their pure expression of a tranquil understanding of the universe, of the harmony between man and nature. An Ho's painting keeps alive an artistic tradition threatened by the contemporary world and re-establishes our connection to the natural universe from which it is derived.
